Maintenance Requests:

Recertifications:

Those of you who are due for recertifications will be delivered paperwork to sign and return at your scheduled interview. If you cannot make it please call Shauna at 216-226-7575 to reschedule. It is very important to come to your scheduled meeting to keep your rent subsidy.

Events:

To attend any event planned by the office staff you must sign up on the events corresponding signup sheet.



Promptness:

Please be on time to any scheduled event you signed up for. If you are unable to attend, please remove yourself from the signup sheets. Most events are planned based on the number of participants. Please do not sign up if you do not plan to attend.

Laundry Room Rules:

Please share the laundry room with your fellow residents. Only 2 washers and 2 dryers in use per tenant. No powder detergent! If an out of order sign is not present the appliance is ready to use. Do not over fill the washers and dryers.

Bag of Groceries:

We will no longer be delivering the bag of groceries which is dropped off every third Tuesday of the month. You must come downstairs to pick it up. If you do not your bag of groceries will be donated. It will be listed on the calendar each month.

Pictures:

We will be taking pictures at our monthly events and putting them on our social media page. If you do not wish to have pictures of you included, please let us know.

Shopping Carts:

The office has shopping carts if needed. Please see office staff to use them



No Smoking:

As of July 1st Fedor Manor has become a no smoking building. By law you may not smoke within 30 feet of any entrance way. This means that you may not smoke by either entry door, the outdoor patio, or the outside stairway entrance. You must move away from the building to smoke. Smoking on the building grounds can result in a lease violation. Please see your house rules for information on this topic.

After Hours Maintenance Emergencies:

If you have an afterhours emergency, please call 216-226-7575 and press 1 to be connected to the emergency service line. Please do not call the maintenance crews phones or knock on their doors. The emergency service will contact them if needed.

Socializing:

Please refrain from 'socializing' in front of any of the building's entryways. This can make it difficult for other residents to enter and exit the building while also causing a safety hazard.

Events:

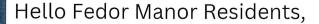
Check the calendar for any upcoming events. All event dates and times will be posted. Signup sheets will be placed on the sign-up table. Please check each event flyer for more information.

This month I wanted to talk about scams.

- Don't share your personal information with unknown callers.
- Don't leave valuables like jewelry, cash, checkbooks, or financial documents lying around.
- Monitor your bank accounts on a regular basis.
- One free copy of your credit report from each of the three credit bureaus is available every year. 1-877-322-8228 www.annualcreditreport.com
- Imposters assume many identities often posing as government officials, employees of well-known businesses, computer technical support, and even family members.
- Don't trust your caller ID.
- Don't answer incoming calls if you don't recognize the number. Don't interact with the caller in any way. Don't press any numbers. Don't respond to any questions especially those that can be answered with a "yes."
- Collect your mail every day and don't let anyone open your mail.
- Safeguard your social security number and don't carry it in your wallet.

Signs it's a scam:

Claim there is a problem with your account or your payment information.



The message states "we have noticed some suspicious activity or log in information."

The messages states "we need you to confirm your personal or financial information."

There is an offer for free stuff.

The messages states "you are eligible to register for a government refund."

There is a scam regarding a fake text or call stating they are from "Medicare" and you are eligible to receive "free gifts" like a medical alert button or watch.

Delivery scams:

You may receive a text message that looks like it is from a legitimate mail or package courier like Amazon or USPS. The message may prompt you to call back to receive your delivery and ask for a fee.

Romance scams:

Be careful of romance scams where somebody creates a false identity online to seduce a stranger and scam them out of money. The red flags are they avoid meeting face to face or video chat. Their picture and what they are telling you is too good to be true. They always seem to need help and get serious way too fast. Their stories and answers to questions are too vague. There are also celebrity scams where a scammer pretends to be a celebrity to get your personal information.

Grandparent scams:

The grandparent scam is when the phone rings and the caller claims to be a grandchild in some sort of distress.

They have been arrested and you need to send them money right away. The caller may say, "please don't let mom or dad know." Always use caution when asked to send money quickly. To ease your mind, call or text your family members directly to make sure they are not in trouble.

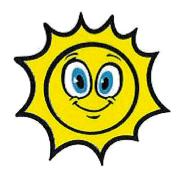
